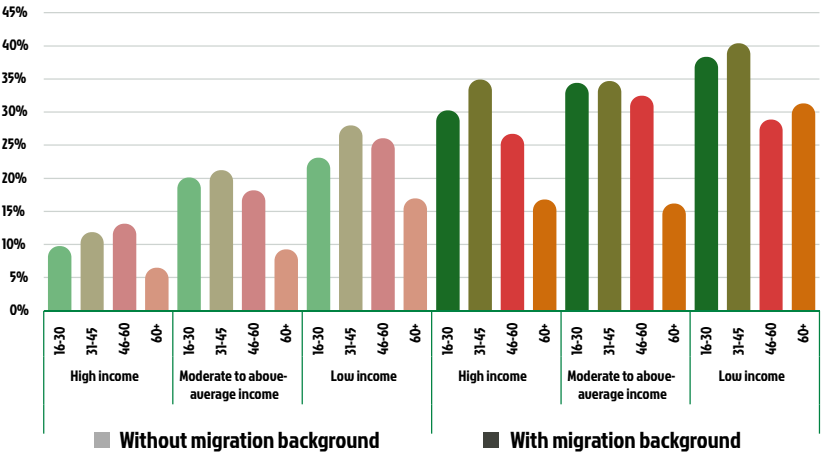
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How prevalent is discrimination in Rotterdam?

Nearly one in four Rotterdammers report having experienced discrimination in 2023.



Discrimination, Age, Income, and Migration Background



Rotterdammers with a migration background report more discrimination across all ages and income groups. The risk is highest when migration background, youth, and low income coincide

Locations of discrimination

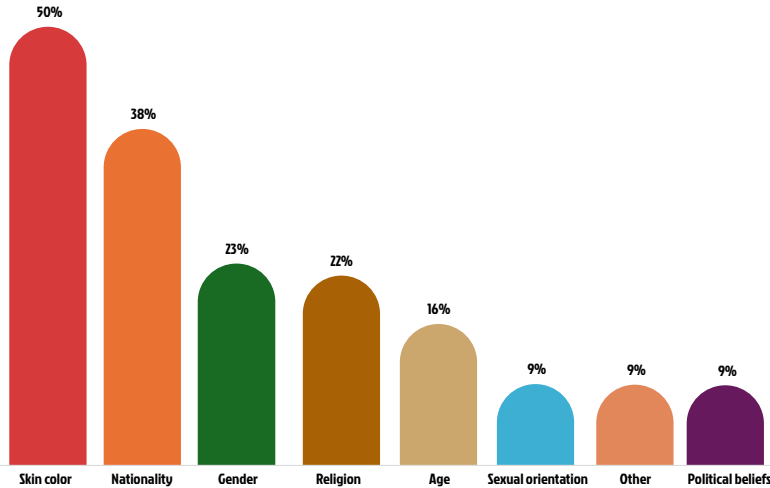


Discrimination on the street is the most prevalent form of discrimination.

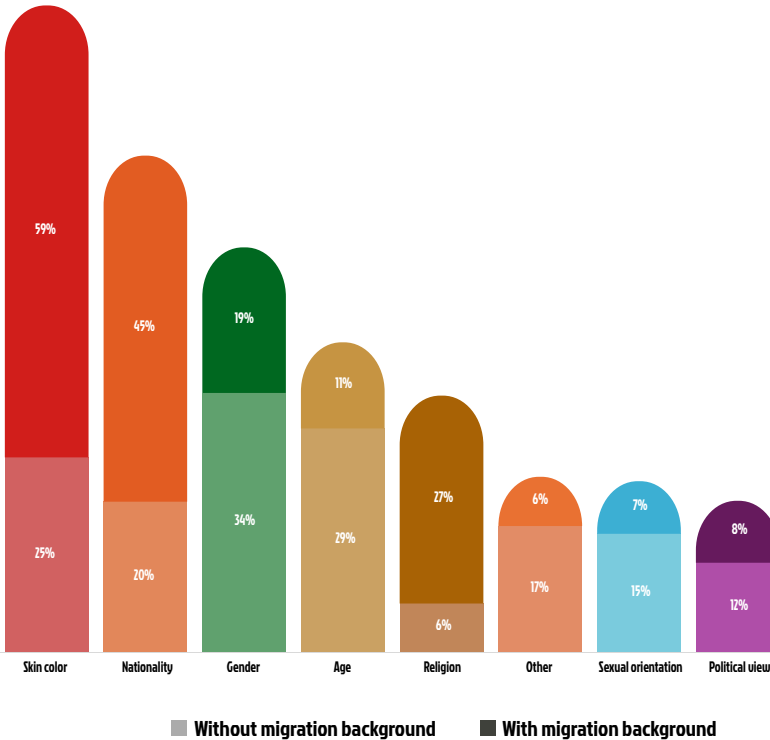
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Why are people discriminated against?

The most common grounds for discrimination differ for Rotterdammers with and without a migration background

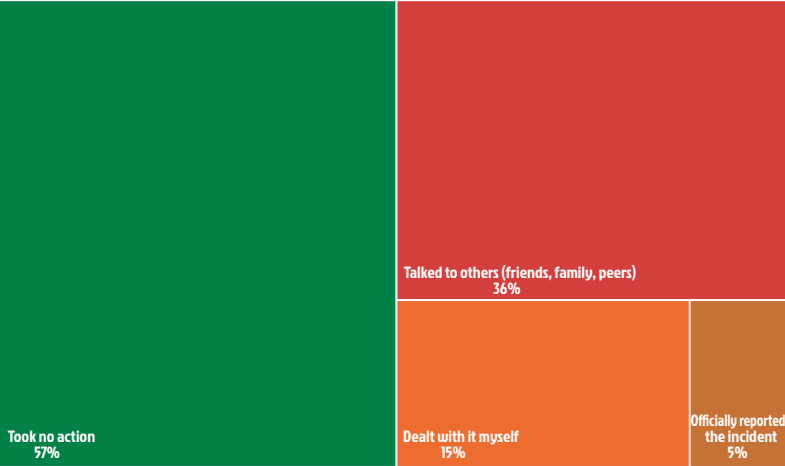


Rotterdammers with a migration background report more discrimination across all ages and income groups. Young people with low income and a migration background have the highest risk of experiencing discrimination.

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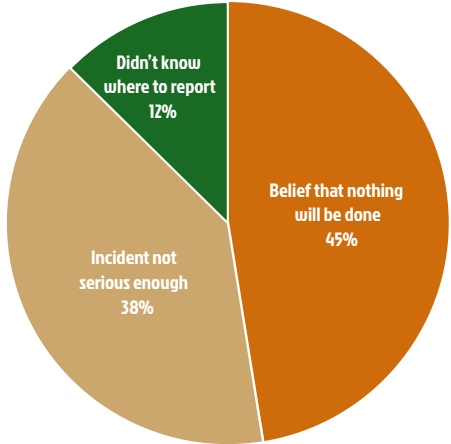
What do people do when faced with discrimination?

Reactions to discrimination



Most people who experience discrimination take no formal action, and only a small minority report their experiences.

Reasons for not reporting



Low reporting is driven by a lack of belief that something will be done about the report, rather than a lack of information about where to report.

Note: Not all percentages add up to 100%. In the survey, respondents could select multiple grounds and multiple locations where they experienced discrimination. As a result, the percentages reflect overlapping reports, matching the reality that people often encounter more than one type or context of discrimination.
